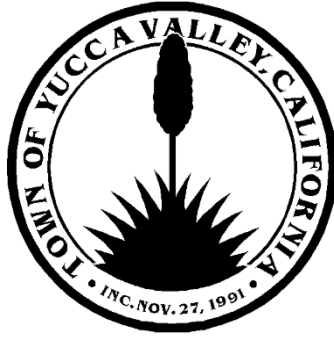

Chair Schooler opened public comments. With no members of the public wishing to speak, public comments were closed.

Department Reports

3. Spay & Neuter Event – March 31, 2026

Chair Schooler opened the public comment period. Greg Gundron expressed thanks and stated they look forward to future updates. A question was raised regarding whether activity at the Animal Care and Control Department is slower during the summer months. The Animal Care and Control Manager May confirmed that activity is slower during the summer months due to hot weather conditions.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

4. Local Media Update, Pets of the Week, Animals at the Shelter more than 6 months

Animal Care and Control Manager May presented the department report, including updates on radio, newspaper, and social media outreach efforts for long-term shelter animals. Committee members discussed adoption activity, rescue partnerships, and several long-term animals currently at the shelter. Residents commented regarding adoptions, rescue efforts, and positive collaboration between staff and the Committee.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

5. April Adoption Event

Animal Care and Control Manager May provided an update on adoption programs and shelter statistics. Long-term animal adoptions remain available for five dollars, while all other adoptions are twenty-five dollars through April. Staff reported on the April Fools' Day adoption event, during which all adoptions were one dollar and all cats, including several "spicy cats," were adopted. Shelter statistics for dogs, cats, and animal transfers were reviewed and compared with prior years, including transfers involving wildlife.

Chair Schooler opened the public comment period and commended the progress made by the department and Committee. With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

6. Microchip Program Update

Animal Care and Control Manager May provided an update on the microchipping program, including statistics for animals microchipped within the Town and County. Staff discussed ongoing efforts to support reunification programs, microchip registration, and the importance of pet owners maintaining current registration information. Public discussion included suggestions for expanding free or low-cost microchipping opportunities and the use of identification tags to help reduce stray animal populations.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

7. March Shelter Statistics

Animal Care and Control Manager May presented the March statistics report. Shelter outcomes included 30 dog adoptions, 13 dogs returned to owners, 6 cat adoptions, and 10 cat transfers. Annual live release rates were reported at 85% for dogs and 91% for cats, with March rates reaching 95% for dogs and 100% for cats. Two dogs with advanced parvo were euthanized after being sent directly to a veterinarian, and the importance of vaccinations was emphasized. Manager May stated the shelter is working to secure a regular veterinarian within 30 days and confirmed behavioral cases are separated.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

8. Volunteer Program Update

Animal Care and Control Manager May provided an update on the volunteer program, including cat volunteer opportunities for “spicy cats.” A new volunteer meeting will be held on April 23 for approved volunteers. Animal Care and Control Manager May stated approved applicants would receive emails and advised anyone who had not received communication to reach out. The meeting will include an introduction to volunteer duties and a shelter tour.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

9. Donor Recognition Program

Animal Care and Control Manager May introduced the Donor Recognition Program

and reviewed proposed donation recognition guidelines, including donor acknowledgment tiers and naming opportunities. Animal Care and Control Manager May discussed donor appreciation, volunteer fundraising efforts, online and recurring donations through Shelterluv, and donation wish lists available through Amazon and Kuranda. Questions were raised about donor recognition, shelter bed needs, and budget support for supplies. Staff noted donation links are available on the Town website and Facebook page and that the program and donation processes are continuing to be developed.

With no additional members of the public wishing to speak, Chair Schooler closed the public comment period. No motion was made.

Future Agenda Items

Chair Schooler requested update on foster program in 60 to 90 days.

Public Comments

Chair Schooler opened public discussion and reminded speakers to follow public comment guidelines.

Residents thanked shelter staff and volunteers for improvements made at the shelter over the past year and discussed ongoing efforts to increase adoptions and community engagement. Questions and comments focused on shelter signage, kennel card information, volunteer opportunities, social media and video promotion of adoptable animals, and posting donation wish lists more prominently online.

Manager May responded to concerns regarding adoptable dog signage and kennel information, stating staff are working to improve communication with visitors and expand volunteer participation as programs develop. Residents were encouraged to continue submitting suggestions by email.

Discussion also included adoption screening practices, Shelterluv updates, stray hold postings, the status of filling an Animal Control Officer position, and opportunities to transport dogs to outside events once volunteer and foster programs are further established.

Residents and commissioners discussed long-term shelter stays, shelter capacity, and potential future expansion funding. Manager May stated staff are working to network dogs before they become long-term residents to reduce stress and improve placement opportunities.

Mayor Drozd thanked staff, volunteers, and community members for their work and participation, and expressing appreciation for everyone in attendance. Chair Schooler thanked staff and attendees for their participation and support.

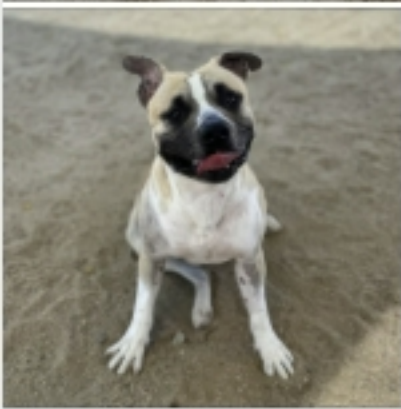

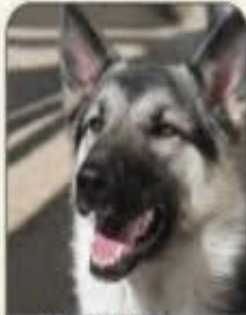
Local Pets Looking for Local Love

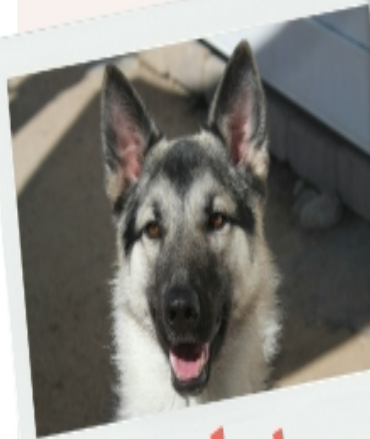

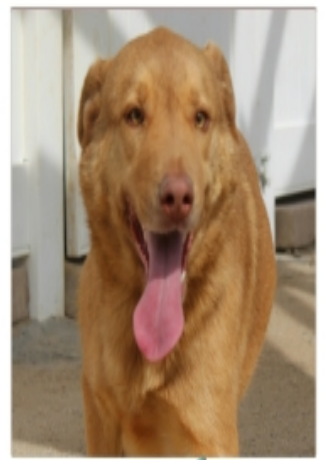

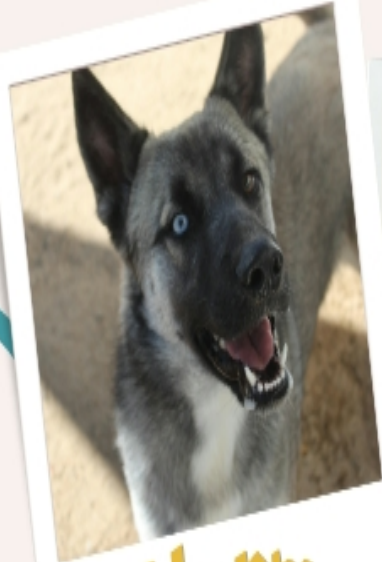
